Membership into ALD is by invitation only. Check with your campus to see when invitations are sent.



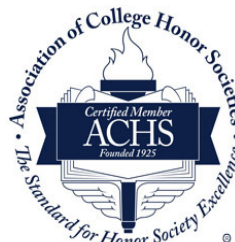
